## How?

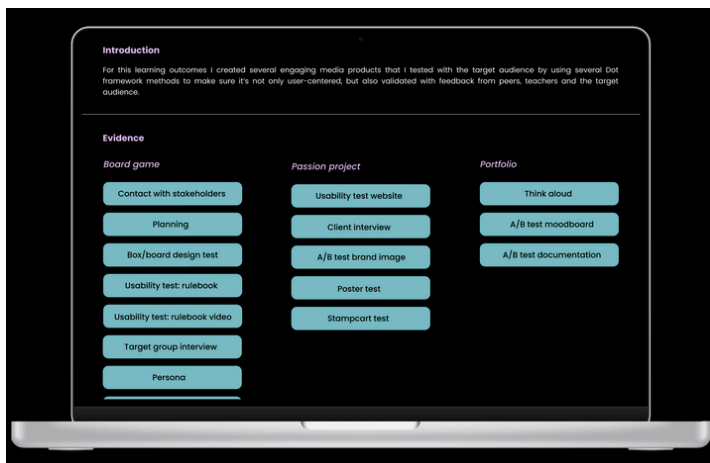
I did an A/B test and showed my two versions to teachers. I asked which one was easier to read and to understand. My teachers recommended the following:
